How did Sector3

- We listened to the sector's concerns about unprecedented service demand and subsequently launched a crowdfunder, which raised over £45,000 to support the sector to adapt and respond to the Covid-19 crisis
- We enabled the sector to unlock opportunities through the creation of spaces for collaboration and information sharing in the form of a weekly Covid response meeting between the sector and key stakeholders

So what have we been doing to foster a thriving third sector in Stockport?





We are championing the voice of the sector:

- We raised the profile of the sector via a clean and clear accessible website, fortnightly news bulletin and dynamic marketing strategy to spotlight the valuable work the sector is doing. This has led to Sector3 brokering more investment into the sector via new and existing funding streams
- We established relationships with influential stakeholders such as Greater Manchester High Sheriff's Trust, GMVCO and The National Lottery Community Fund to inject increased funding into the sector and reduce reliance on Local Authority funding.



We are championing the voice of the sector:

We worked with Stockport Council to invest £30,000 into the sector to support thematic networks. A pioneering move in financing the sector to tackle inequalities (Equity Network) and food poverty (Stockport Food Network) in the borough:

• Stockport Food
Network – now run by
two members of the
Stockport VCFSE sector in
paid positions thanks to
funding from Stockport
Council. The network are
benefitting from shared
resources including
surplus food and recently
held their first Food Drive
as well as an appearance
on BBC Radio Manchester.

• By promoting the **State** of the Sector survey and facilitating focus groups we have Increased our knowledge of the size and diversity of the VCFSE sector plus the sector's challenges. We are now in a stronger position to support the sector and have clear recommendations to overcome them through the publication of the State of the Stockport VCSE sector report 2021

Directed £279,000 into the sector

Plus capacity building support during the most challenging and unprecedented times in social action

We are investing in social action:

- We administered over £130,000 in easy-access funding across 82 Voluntary, Community and Faith-based groups and Social Enterprises (VCFSE) supporting communities on the ground in Stockport
- We understood the impact lockdown would have on the sector's fundraising abilities, therefore we galvanised public support for the sector through a crowdfunder that raised over £45,000 to enable local organisations to continue to support their communities throughout the pandemic
- We secured over £85,000 of stakeholder funding through Stockport Council and a Stockport County crowdfunder, to administer across the sector through funding pots
- We launched an easy-access funding process for below the radar, grassroots groups through the delivery of 3 Community Soup events, which gave them seed-funding to grow

We are investing in social action:

- We increased funding
 to organisations
 supporting Afghan
 Evacuees through
 securing and
 administering over
 £19,000 to those working
 with the evacuee
 community
- We launched the first Stockport Volunteer Hub, a joint venture with Healthwatch Stockport, building a network of volunteer resource reaching into the heart of communities
- We bought services from those in the sector to keep the Stockport pound going round

We are bolstering the sustainability of the sector:

We built **strategic partnerships** with organisations to strengthen the sector:

- Stockport County donated over £200,000 of their crowdfunder to Sector3 to administer to the sector through the Stockport Food Fund and to key stakeholders providing support for families in need
- Mayor of Stockport Charity partnership – the first time a Mayor in Stockport has chosen an infrastructure organisation as their charity partner. The partnership raised over £30,000 to support the development of Stockport's volunteer offer, which will

benefit the sector and communities across the borough

- Recognised the importance of data to the sustainability of the sector. Secured funding to invest in a CRM to gain insight on the sector's impact, in order to attract future funding into the sector
- Cultivation of the next generation of Social Entrepreneurs in Stockport with the first ever Inspiring Enterprise education programme; which saw 10 participants not only learn skills, knowledge and contacts in the enterprise world, but build confidence in their abilities and future career path

We are bolstering the sustainability of the sector:

• We campaigned relentlessly to bring a long-awaited Social Enterprise investment programme into Stockport, the first of its kind. One of only four boroughs chosen in Greater Manchester, Proper Good Business, launched in May this year and will provide customised support for Social Entrepreneurs.



- We implemented 1:1 on the ground tailored support for the sector through recruitment of an Equality, Diversity & Inclusion Lead and a full-time Engagement & Partnerships Lead.
- We collaborated with VCFSE's to host capacity building events to enable skills sharing across the sector

We've provided 1:1 support to 122 different organisations

Short-term goals

- Continue to build engagement with the sector on the ground through newly appointed Engagement & Partnerships Lead
- Roll out engagement plan including accessible events schedule to arm the sector with the support to thrive
- Develop the Stockport Volunteer Hub service through the Volunteer Hub Lead, supporting a thriving volunteer network
- Launch the Proper Good Business programme to provide financial support, networking opportunities and mentorship to Social Entrepreneurs across the borough
- Cultivate up and coming thematic networks such as the Refugee & Asylum Seeker hub and Veterans Network, facilitating progress through collaboration
- Build on our ability to support the sector with its digital capacity in partnership with Stockport's award-winning Digital Alliance

Long-term goals

- Continue to drive new investment into the third sector.
- Use our data and insights to promote the value and impact the VCFSE brings to our borough
- Continue to harness the right conditions for Stockport's third sector to thrive, led by the sector, for the sector


